



Student Spotlight

Kristen Koci is a Doctoral Candidate in the Department of Sociology at Utah State University (USU). At USU, Kristen has worked with Dr. Courtney Flint on various projects including the Water Reuse Project studying perceptions of treated wastewater quality and human health risks associated with exposure to treated wastewater; the Utah Wellbeing Project surveying Utahns about their perceived wellbeing, and a project exploring perceptions of children's health and safety risks posed by irrigation water in Northern Utah. Kristen is currently working on a project with Dr. Jessica Ulrich-Schad exploring mental health and suicide trends, as well as contributing factors to poor mental health and suicide deaths, in rural natural resource-dependent places in Utah. For her particular research, Kristen's focus is on rural mental health. She is examining how people from different types of rural natural resource-dependent places in Utah perceive mental health in their communities, including how barriers (such as mental health stigma) and access to mental health care influence mental health. Along with this, Kristen is exploring how mental health and wellbeing vary throughout the state of Utah more generally, looking at how individuals across the rural-urban continuum differ in their perspectives on mental health and wellbeing. Throughout this research, Kristen is assessing needed solutions or resources for addressing mental health issues in rural, natural resource dependent places, and exploring how Extension faculty working with rural communities view the opportunities and challenges in relation to tackling mental health problems.

As a graduate student, Kristen encourages others to pursue their interests and hopes you all remember to carve out time in your busy schedules to rest!
