


PARTICIPANT DEMOGRAPHICS

UTAH COLLEGE SEXUAL BEHAVIOR SURVEY (N = 1,172)

We do not have a good understanding of the sexual behaviors of Utah youth, as the Youth Risk Behavior Survey in Utah does not ask youth to report their sexual behaviors. Consequently, there is minimal evidence-based information to inform Utah programming, legislation, and prevention measures. Additionally, most sexual behavior research and the programming that is informed by research are largely heteronormative with an emphasis on penile penetration.


To address these gaps, this study aimed to create and pilot a valid and reliable inclusive sexual behavior questionnaire and collect statewide retrospective sexual behavior data among Utah State University (USU) students ages 18-21.
